Lee.	July 8, 1497 — Europeans begin their first direct ocean voyage to Asia. Portuguese explorer Vasco da Gama pilots an armada of 4 ships and 170 men from Lisbon south to Africa's cape and then east towards India, the longest known sea journey of its time.	July 15, 1799 — The key to unlocking ancient hieroglyphs is found in Egypt. A large slab inscribed with three different languages, including hieroglyphics and Ancient Greek, is discovered by a soldier in Napoleon's Egyptian campaign. Once part of a monument from 196 BCE, the Rosetta Stone will be the modern world's key to deciphering an- cient Egyptian hieroglyphics.	July 22, 1587 — English colonists land at Ro- anoke Island. Hundreds of English settlers arrive on Roanoke Island, off the coast of present- day North Carolina. Although a previous colony on the island had vanished, Sir Walter Raleigh hopes this second colony will flourish. But three years lat- er, relief ships will find it completely deserted, and the Lost Colony of Roanoke will become a haunting mystery.	July 29, 1981 — London's royal wedding transfixes millions . Deemed the 'wedding of the century,' the nuptials between Lady Diana Spen- cer and Prince Charles are broadcast live to more than 700 million global viewers. Over 2,000 guests, including the groom's mother, Queen Elizabeth II, witness the vows at London's St. Paul's Cathedral.
