Boomerang Adventures Trip on Aug. 16: Maine's Botanical Garden & River Tour, Boothbay Harbor, ME

It took 16 years to plan and build these extensive gardens. We'll spend the morning on a docent-lead garden tour that comprises the 250 acres of gardens and grounds. These gardens offer everything from manicured formal gardens, interactive art displays, waterfalls and spectacular stonework, to rambling paths down to a mile of waterfront under a natural tree canopy.

Cost includes a private tour, luncheon in the gardens, transportation/carpooling coordination (pick up in York ME). Optional activities include a one-hour, tidal water quiet river cruise aboard a 7 passenger electric coast guard vessel and an accessible golf cart tour. Trip capacity: Min. 20/Max 30.

Deem ed the 'wedding of the century,' the nuptials between Lady Diana Spencer and Prince Charles are broadcast live to more than 700 million global viewers. Over 2,000 guests, including the groom's mother, Queen Elizabeth II, witness the vows at London's St. Paul's Cathedral.
